

- Counts towards both high school and
 - college credit
- Recommended to
 - wait until 11th and
 - 12th grade

- Up to 2 courses per
 - semester
- Book fee is \$70

Dual Enrollment Requirements:

Key requirements include the following:

- Academic readiness, social maturity and motivation
- Not yet graduated from high school
- Meet GPA (3.5) and test score eligibility requirement (SAT, ACT, MAPS, PSAT)
- Successfully complete courses, with a "C" or better, receiving both high school and college credit for the course
- Recommendation from English and Math Teacher




Why continue your education?

Annual Median Earnings for workers Aged 22-27





• Well balanced high school career

Technical College:

- Programs are usually shorter than 4 years
- Higher post-training job placement than college
- Specialized training, limiting income range



Examples of technical school careers:

- Barbering \$20k-\$46k
- Building Construction Technologies \$35k-\$108k
- Cosmetology \$17k-\$35K
- Dental Assisting \$35k-\$51k
- Diesel Systems Technician 1 \$22k-\$89k
- Electrician- \$40k-\$70k
- HVAC- \$34k-\$63k
- Patient Care Technician \$17k-\$50k
- Pharmacy Technician \$36k-\$45k

Freshman year:

- Do well in all of your classes, your GPA starts here!
- Get involved in activities: Sports, Chapel, Student Government, After-School Clubs.
- Start thinking about what field of work you want to go into.
- Go on college tours!

Sophomore Year:



Continue to do well in your classes



Take the PSAT 10 in March and set up a College Board account.



Continue involvement in activities



Apply for the COLCA Chapter of the National Honor Society



Gather information from colleges. Request brochures and catalogs and attend college fairs



Begin practicing for the SAT on Khan Academy.



Junior Year

Sign up and take the PSAT in the Fall and SAT in the Spring

Register for College Fairs



Decide on a college or career path the spring of your Junior Year, meet with Counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate.



Begin actively searching for scholarships and financial aid



Maintain good grades, consider taking a Dual Enrollment course.

Fall Semester:

- Sign up for the SAT and/or ACT in the Fall. Review results, study on Khan Academy, and test again if necessary.
- Complete college applications by the fall of your senior year.
- Start the financial aid application process: FAFSA and Bright Futures
- Meet with Counselor to make sure you are on track with graduation requirements.
 - Consider taking additional electives or Dual Enrollment courses

Spring Semester:

Find out if you qualify for any scholarships at the colleges that you applied.



Solidify career or technical school decisions.

Accept admission offers & make enrollment deposits (if required)



Maintain your GPA, work hard, and have fun!
